WORD

MATTHEW 6:9-15

⁹“Pray, then, in this way:
‘Our Father, who is in
heaven, hallowed be Your
name. ¹⁰Your kingdom
come. Your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
¹¹ Give us this day our daily
bread. ¹² And forgive us
our debts, as we also have
forgiven our debtors. ¹³
And do not lead us into
temptation but deliver us
from evil’ ¹⁴ For if you
forgive other people for
their offenses, your
heavenly Father will also
forgive you. ¹⁵ But if you
do not forgive other
people, then your Father
will not forgive your
offenses.”

The world celebrates Father’s Day and honors fathers from all walks of life, but a common difficulty on occasions such as this is faced by those who do not have “fathers” (passed on early, absentees, or distant), or those who do not have “good father” examples. Through this message, we look at the example of “A Father Like No Other”— our Heavenly Father! In the Old Testament, God is described as “Father” only 15 times. However, in the New Testament, Jesus used the term “Father” referring to God over 165 times, and if we include the epistles from the Apostle Paul and others, it is used over 200 times. The Creator of the heavens and the earth is our Father, and Jesus even used a term of endearment “Abba” because He wants us to know that God is our Father!

We will look at the famous model of prayer in Matthew 6 prescribed by Jesus and see the things we can learn about God as our Father:

1. PREEMINENCE

The word **pre-eminence** means above others when it comes to ranking that signifies what is “most important”. In other words, “**Our Father who is in Heaven**” is uniquely superior – there is no equal. Because of His preeminence, what must we do? **Matthew 6:9** states “**Hallowed be Your Name**”. The word ‘hallowed’ comes from the Greek word **HAGIAZO** which means to make holy, set apart, glorify, and honor Him. The opposite of hallowing God’s Name is to ‘profane’ His Name. When we live our lives in a way that brings shame to the Name of the Lord, we are not treating Him with the respect He deserves. To be a good father, you must be able to lead your family in hallowing and revering God’s Name. Your life should reflect that God is **priority** in your own life and in the lives of your family members. Observe what consumes your time the most; what do you love most, what excites you, and what keeps you busy. Is your relationship with the preeminent God standing out? It’s never too late to change! **Matthew 6:10** emphasizes that it is about His kingdom, His priority. It is one thing to know God’s will and be able to do it. To reflect that God is preeminent in your life, your choices and actions should always be glorifying to Him. To show the preeminence of God in our life is not done by mere talking, but it must be done in action.

2. PROVIDER

Matthew 6:11 states a request – “**Give us this day our daily bread**”. The word daily bread comes from the Greek word **EPIOUSIOS** which translates to as “the need for the day”. This word is so unique and was probably invented by the Gospel writers. It combines two words to mean “**whatever is the need TODAY**”. A good father will provide (**1 Timothy 5:8**). God expects fathers to provide for their families. While there are exceptions, it is a general rule for fathers to provide.

Matthew 6:25-26 reminds us not to worry because we have a Heavenly Father. If God will provide for the birds, how much more will He provide for you and me? Our Heavenly Father is an amazing Provider! The average father will spend roughly 20+ seconds for interaction with his children each day. But there are other needs aside from physical needs, such as emotional and spiritual needs. It is so important that a father must be will-

ing to spend time with his children. Do you know the needs of your children? God does not only know, but He is also able to provide! **Matthew 7:9-11** shows that God not only knows our needs and provides, but He also knows what is best and when best to give that something to us. **2 Kings 4:1-7** is a story that shows that even if God provides (the oil miraculously multiplied, providing for the widow in dire need), the expectation is **we do our part as well**. For the widow, she had to visit as many neighbors and borrow as many vessels as she can. So, God is our provider, but **we are to do our part as well**.

3. HE PARDONS

Matthew 6:12 reminds us that God forgives (**Gk. APHIEMI**, to send away or cancel). Jesus wants us to know that our Heavenly Father is a forgiving Father. Forgiveness is so crucial, that a few verses down (**v.14-15**) Jesus reminds us that we must be able to forgive. It is not an option, but a command. Because our Father is forgiving and pardoned us, God expects us to forgive others. Many family problems can be traced back to lack of forgiveness. Fathers must develop a culture of forgiveness in the household. **Psalms 103:8, 10-12** paints a perfect picture of God's lovingkindness and willingness to forgive our great iniquities. The forgiveness of God is based on His compassion and grace, and therefore able to abound in love! Forgiveness is letting go. It is an amazing thing to embrace about our God, because many people today desire to be forgiven.

4. PROTECTS

Matthew 6:13 shows the petition we ask of our Heavenly Father to "not lead us to temptation (**peirasmos**, meaning trials and hardships)" and "deliver us from evil (**poneros**, meaning pain, suffering, and evil)". It's okay to expect your father to protect and guide you. The word **peirasmos** can be positive or negative as in the case we see in **James 1:13**. Its verb form **peirazo** is used in the verse negatively as something that causes you to sin, but there are certain trials that He allows. **1 Peter 1:6-7** is a good reference to this, as the positive form of the word pertains to that which proves our faith. Faith is crucial and it has to be genuine. When God allows trials, He allows it to refine and build us up. It is calibrated clearly, as can be seen in **1 Corinthians 10:13**. This truth is a great comfort, because whatever trial that God allows, it is there to build us up; no trial is beyond His ability to help us endure. Part of a father's job is to protect. Sometimes, it will mean DISCIPLINE. **Hebrews 12:6-7** is a reminder that the consequences of our bad choices are allowed so we can learn what is right and wrong. **Hebrews 12:10-11** tells us that a good father disciplines, not for the purpose of punishment, but to train his children. **Ephesians 6:4** is a great instruction on how to discipline children, and how to avoid being over-controlling or not disciplining at all.

5. PASSIONATE

Our Heavenly Father loves us so much. **1 John 3:1** reminds us of His great love. It is an amazing love – do you know God loves you so much that He is calling you to be His child? How does He become your Father? **John 1:12** tells us not everyone is considered as His children, because we must first receive and believe in Jesus. **Galatians 4:4** tells us God sent Jesus Christ, for what purpose? Our redemption! It's so you and I can become children of God. To become a child of God is an amazing privilege. Make sure you and your family are connected through Jesus, to our Perfect Father – **a Father Like No Other!**
