GOD'S LOVE

What's your picture of "the best life"? In Colossians 3, God recalibrates our perspective on having "the best life" and calls on us to completely trust Him. As Jesus himself stated in John 10:10, He came to give us life, and to give it abundantly. Why then are we still looking elsewhere to find happiness and fulfillment?

SET YOUR MIND ON THINGS ABOVE

Once we give our lives to Jesus, we die to our old life, and are raised to a new life. When we "seek the things that are above," that doesn't mean we let go of our earthly duties and responsibilities. It means that everything that happens, we must view it through the lens of eternity. Be careful what you let into your mind — your thoughts impact your emotions, and your emotions influence your actions. If you are always thinking about the wrong things, you are giving Satan a foothold, and his lies will warp how you view your circumstances.

When Jesus told the story of a very successful man (Luke 12:16-21), He explained that it's foolish to only focus on possessions and earthly things. Instead, when you set your mind on things above, you're thinking about God's kingdom first - and that has eternal value.

As believers, we have died, and our lives are hidden with Christ in God (Colossians 3:3). To say that we have died in Christ does not mean we have physically died. To have died with Christ means:

- A spiritual reality of our union with Christ (Galatians 2:20)
- 2. New identity (2 Corinthians 5:17)
- Judicial freedom (Romans 7:6) 3.
- The power of sin has been broken (Romans 4. 6:14,18)

Even when you're faithfully following Jesus, there is no guarantee that there's no more temptation. But when faced with temptation, remember that you are a child of God, and not a slave to sin! When Christ comes again, we too will be "revealed with Him in glory"— which means we are destined for glory (Colossians 3:4)! We are "heirs" of God (Romans 8:17-18). God has something so amazing for us, and the early believers knew this. They focused on things above because they knew God's best will always be better than anything else.

PUT OFF THE OLD LIFE

In Colossians 3:5-7, a variety of sins were called out as earthly, and the command is to 'put it to death'. In line with the call to set our mind on things above, we must put these sins away. Colossians 3:8-9 also lists "respectable sins" we take lightly, but are still wrong in the eyes of God, like anger, malice, and slander. There are no levels to this; to a holy God, sin is sin. If we continue to disobey, we are bound to incur the wrath of God. If we truly want God's best for our lives, we need to put off a lifestyle of sin.

PUT ON THE NEW LIFE

We are called to put on our new identity in Christ (Colossians 3:10-11). God is at work in us, we are "chosen, holy and beloved" (v.12). So that means our virtues and character should be aligned with God's will (Galatians 5:22-23). God began a good work in us and will continue to work in and through us in Christ Jesus (Philippians 1:6)! And so, we must work out our salvation (Philippians 2:12-13) - this does not mean there are ways to earn our salvation. What this command means is to live out that which is already in us.

A "heart transplant" has been made — because of what Christ did, the things we previously enjoyed are now things that embarrass us and contradict our new nature. We may fall into sin, but we have something in us that will save us. We are to bear with one another, forgive each other, as we are forgiven in Christ (Colossians 3:13-14). On top of these, we put on love. The peace of Christ should rule in our hearts, and we should be growing in these virtues (v.15). The peace of Christ does not just mean harmony with others; it is also personal - having a clear conscience. When we do that which is not pleasing to God, we lose that peace.

At the end of his life, Paul states his confidence that a great future lies ahead of him, including a crown of righteousness (2 Timothy 4:7-8). "The best life" aspires for that - to someday stand before the Lord and hear Him sweetly say to us "well done, good and faithful servant!"
