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LAST WEEK'S MESSAGE

What does it mean to volunteer?

To volunteer is to personally commit to and desire to contribute one's time, skills, or talents willingly for a greater cause, without compulsion and without payment. Volunteering benefits us as well: research has shown that if you volunteer to serve and help others, you become healthier and more joyful. Volunteerism is for our own good, and as God's church, we are reminded to "serve the Lord [our] God with joy and a glad heart" (Deuteronomy 28:47-48) in the form of biblical volunteerism:

SECULAR VOLUNTEERISM	BIBLICAL VOLUNTEERISM
seeks recognition	seeks God's glory
pick and choose	responds to a need
commitment with conditions	servant heart, no pre-conditions
glamorous work	big or small

Biblical volunteerism is service that is patterned after Jesus. He is the ultimate example of servanthood, as "the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28). However, we sometimes have different reasons for not serving, such as lack of time, lack of talent, lack of opportunity, disappointment with leaders, ignorance, and ultimately, a lack of heart. But we must remember that we are called to freedom, not to indulge the desires of our flesh, but to serve one another through love (Galatians 5:13)! We need to make time for things that are truly important and pleasing to God, such as serving Him with joy. How do we do this?

GRACE OF GOD

Grace is "God's Riches At Christ's Expense" — it is undeserved, unmerited, unconditional, and uncoerced favor, freely given by God and paid for by Jesus. The first chapters of Romans present a systematic explanation of what God has done by His grace alone: they explain man's sinfulness (Romans 1-3), God's salvation (Romans 3-5), God's sanctification (Romans 6-8), God's sovereignty (Romans 9-11), and man's response (Romans 12-15). We are ultimately recipients of God's grace, forgiveness, and mercy; and in understanding His grace we also recognize that by it, He enables us to serve Him out of love. We are saved by grace alone through faith alone, not by our good works — our good

works, such as service, are evidence of our salvation. (Ephesians 2:8-10) As John Stott says, "Good works are indispensable to salvation – not as its grounds or means, however, but as its consequence and evidence." We don't do good works to earn points for heaven!

GRATITUDE TO GOD

Gratitude leads to action. C.T. Studd once said, "If Christ be God and died for me, then no sacrifice can be too great for me to make for Him." Simply put, we must give our all to God in appreciation and thankfulness for the every good thing we have received from Him. If we have been crucified with Christ and it is no longer us who live, but Christ lives in us (Galatians 2:20), we are to learn to surrender our all to Him and say yes to everything He wants us to do. This is part of how we present our bodies as a living and holy sacrifice to God, our "spiritual service" (Gk. logizomai: logical, reasonable) to Him (Romans 12:1).

This is contrary to how secular volunteerism is, but it is proof that as we live redeemed lives, our minds are renewed and our lives are transformed. We are to allow God to transform and change us instead of continuing to copy the ways of the world (Romans 12:2), and to dwell on the truth of His word as it changes the way we live and enables us to understand the "good, acceptable, and perfect" will of God. 1 John 2:15-16 also reminds us to move away from the ways of the world (lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes, boastful pride of life). If we are grateful to God for His grace, we will be submit to Him and serve Him with all our hearts.

GIFT OF GOD

God has given us all we need to serve Him, including grace and faith. In Romans 12:3-8, we learn that He has given us different functions to work together as one body. The church is the body of Christ — every part is important! We are "a royal priesthood" that must "proclaim the excellencies of Him" (1 Peter 2:9), even in how we serve. We are to help one another and serve one another as good stewards of the grace of God, using the gifts given to us (see 1 Peter 4:10 also). When we see a need, we are to step out, volunteer, and serve! Let us volunteer with our time, talent, treasure, influence, and even our own trials and sufferings where others may see Christ's work in us and glorify Him.

May we all choose to do all the good we can, for God's greater glory, honor, and praise!
