Make Your Family a Blessing

God's design for the family is to be a blessing within and to others. You can make a positive impact on your spouse and children (for spouses and parents); parents, siblings, and other relatives (for young and adult children); and on your spiritual family (for all followers of Jesus). But the greatest threat to the family today is idolatry of self — the most dangerous form of idolatry — and external threats are taking advantage of this internal problem. How do we address this threat and make our family a blessing? Let's look at the example of the Rechabites.

Identity: Anchored in Christ

WHO were the Rechabites? (Jeremiah 35:1-6)

During Jeremiah's lifetime as a prophet, the Lord had him do a lot of strange things as object lessons to prove a point to the Israelites. He ministered during a time when the southern kingdom of Judah was precariously close to being invaded, taken over, and eventually exiled by the Babylonians. In Jeremiah 35:1-6, the Lord commanded Jeremiah to bring the Rechabites to a "chamber in the house of the Lord" and give them wine to drink — but all of them refused to drink wine.

The Rechabites were not Israelites but were assimilated among them. Rechab was a Kenite, related to the Midianites (Jethro, Moses' father-in-law). They were nomads (tent dwellers) and adhered to a lifestyle that went "against the tide", starting with their forefather Jonadab. Similarly, we are to live against the tide as members of God's family. In His love, we are adopted as His children (1 John 3:1) when we surrender our lives in faith to Jesus. Our identity is also anchored in Him:

John 1:12	I am God's child.
1 Corinthians 6:20	I have been bought with a price.
1 Corinthians 12:27	I am a member of Christ's body.
Ephesians 1:4-5, 7	I have been chosen, adopted, redeemed, and forgiven by God.
Colossians 2:10	I am complete in Christ.
Romans 8:38-39	Nothing can separate me from God's love.
Ephesians 2:10	I am God's masterpiece.

Integrity: Anchored on God's Word WHY were the Rechabites so different? (Jeremiah 35:7-10)

The Rechabites lived a principle-centered life. Aside from not drinking wine, there was a host of other things that Jonadab said this family would live by (vv.7-10). Part of what was passed on to the next generation was the assurance that they may live long — and they never forgot this promise. They knew that there is blessing in obedience.

Integrity is more than just honesty. It means we consistently live a principle-centered life and are the same person outside and inside the home. As children of God, the principles we live by must be based on God's principles. What can we learn from the Rechabites that we can apply in our own lives?

 I will give God full control of my life by being filled with His Holy Spirit. (1 Corinthians 6:12)

Inheritance: Anchored on Pleasing God WHAT did God have to say about them? (Jeremiah 35:12-17)

Through the example of the Rechabites, God was telling His people that His desire is to bless them and for them to enjoy His blessing. However, the people did not bother to listen to what He had to say (vv.12-17). Ultimately, the Lord recognized how the Rechabites listened to their earthly father and rebuked the Israelites for not listening to their own heavenly Father.

What God thinks of us is important. What will God say about us?

Integration

HOW can we apply these principles so our families can be a blessing? (Jeremiah 35:18-19)

Bible commentators estimate the gap from Jonadab (800++ BC) to Jaazaniah (600++ BC) to be 240 to 250 years, at least 6 generations. They never forgot who their father was and what he told them. In Jeremiah 35:18-19, God blessed the Rechabites by assuring their family that they will always have people who will know, love, believe, and serve Him. How do we apply that to our family today?

Words on your heart	study and apply the Bible personally; set the example
Teach diligently	whet appetite; sharpen like knives
Sit, walk, lie, rise	grab every opportunity
hand, forehead	apply in our thoughts and actions
doorposts of house; gates	create a God' centered environment

God's greatest blessing came through families - through Abraham in Genesis 12:3, Isaac in Genesis 26:4, and Jacob in Genesis 28:14 — but the greatest blessing of all is Jesus (John 3:16)! Let God bless you first, then go make your family a blessing!
