

# Judah: Go Back to God

LAST WEEK'S MESSAGE

We all have regrets about past mistakes. Sometimes, our regrets are so deep that we're at a loss for what we should do next. In the Bible, we learn of two ways that we can respond to our failures: genuine repentance or mere remorse. Let's unpack the difference between genuine and counterfeit repentance through the lives of two men: Judas Iscariot and Judah, son of Jacob.

# What is fake repentance?

Judas Iscariot was one of Jesus' twelve disciples. He ate with Jesus, witnessed Jesus' love, teachings, and miracles firsthand, and yet, Judas still betrayed Him for thirty pieces of silver – no more than the price of a slave (Matthew 26:14-16). Though he was later filled with regret and returned the money, Judas did not seek forgiveness. Instead of running to the Lord, he ran away from Him, choosing instead to end his life in despair (Matthew 27:3-5).

Judas' response illustrates fake repentance, which is merely remorse over the consequences of sin rather than a true return to God. Because Judas' heart had been hardened by sin, he was unable to fully grasp the grace that Jesus offers. More than regret, true repentance is a complete change of heart that leads us back to God and His salvation (2 Corinthians 7:10).

# What is true repentance?

Judah, the son of Jacob and Leah, was no stranger to making terrible mistakes. Out of jealousy, Judah and his brothers sold Joseph, their younger brother, into slavery (Genesis 37:26-28). In the years that followed, Judah and his brothers covered up their sin and deceived their father who continued to mourn

and refused to be comforted (Genesis 37:31-35). Judah's mistakes didn't stop there, though. Later in his life, Judah fathered a child with Tamar, his widowed daughter-in-law (Genesis 38:25). This time, however, instead of hiding his sin like he did with his father, Judah admitted to his wrongdoing, which led to a crucial turning point in his life (Genesis 38:26). Unlike Judas, Judah embraced true repentance, which spurred on a transformation in his heart and actions.

# The Road to True Repentance

Twenty-one years after selling Joseph into slavery, Judah faced an important decision when he and his brothers traveled to Egypt to buy grain. Joseph, who was now second in command in Egypt, secretly tested his brothers, demanding that Benjamin be brought to him. Not only did Judah offer himself as the surety for Benjamin (Genesis 43:8-9), but he also intervened and offered himself up to be Joseph's slave in Benjamin's place (Genesis 44:32-34). Judah chose love over selfinterest, willing to lose everything so that he could make up for the wrong things he had done. These actions led to reconciliation with Joseph and the restoration of their family. Ultimately, God honored Judah's true repentance, making him an ancestor of Jesus Christ (Genesis 49:8-10). True repentance seeks God's mercy and restoration, which results in a transformed heart and actions, and leads to life.
