LAST WEEK'S MESSAGE

We are all called to a life of worship — defined as our proper response to who God is, what He has done, what He continues to do, and what He will do in the future. How you view God directly affects how you worship.

In the book of Malachi, the people have gone back to the land of Israel, but their hearts were not yet fully restored to God. Going through this book can help realign us towards a life of worship.

believe God loves you

God told us "I have loved you with an everlasting love" (Jeremiah 31:3). Still, not all of us believe this and we are not yet fully convinced about God's love for us.

How did God show this to His people? God's response was: He loved Jacob, and "hated Esau" (Malachi 1:2-3). The Bible uses this language in a comparative sense (see Luke 14:26); it emphasizes contrast. If we focus our love on other things, it reduces our capacity to truly love God with all our hearts. But if we do the latter, then it increases our capacity to love others too! Even before Jacob could do anything, God already loved Jacob; proof that God's love is unconditional, uncoerced, & undeserved.

The future of Edom (Esau's land) was predicted in Malachi 1:3; though both Israel and Edom were sinners and deserved God's judgment, the Israelites had the promise of restoration, while the Edomites have ceased to exist. This is teaching us that to understand God's love for us during times of trials, we should not judge God based on circumstances, but we are to judge our circumstances based on who God is.

bring God your best

Not only were the people unaware of God's amazing love, but also, they do not worship God with their best (Malachi 1:6-10). They choose the lame, blind, and sick animals to offer to the Lord. God even rebukes their feelings during worship - they find serving and worshipping God as something boring or tiring (Malachi 1:13).

What does it mean to give God your best? It means to do what God wants us to do. God established some ground rules for their offering (Leviticus 1:2-4). It symbolizes the principle of substitution – that sin is so serious, and it cannot be paid for by good works. The animal sacrificial system is a foreshadowing of the coming of Jesus. The book of Hebrews tells us (Hebrews 10:4,11-14) - Jesus is the one sacrifice we all need!

Today we don't need to offer animal sacrifices, so in response to what Jesus did, we do as Romans 12:1 tells us – to present our bodies as "living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God" and this is our spiritual service of worship!

be consistent in your public. private, and family life

There must be no hypocrisy in our worship of God. In Malachi 2:1-2, the rebuke was spoken to the priests, and God cursed even their blessings, because they "are not taking it to heart". Our life must be consistent – whether in public, in private, and as seen in our families.

Peter reminds us in 1 Peter 2:9 that we are also a royal priesthood, chosen as God's own possession. The problem with these people in Malachi 2 was that they have corrupted their live by corrupting their marriages, divorce, and choosing to give in to their union with foreign women who worship other gods. Because of God's love for us. He does not want us to freefall into destruction, thus He set boundaries to help safeguard us.

Through the power of Jesus Christ alone, you can believe that God loves you, you can bring your best to Him, and you can be consistent in all aspects of your life. That is how you live a life of worship!
